PAYMENT AND PERFORMANCE BONDS: Upon award bidder shall provide the required Performance and Payment Bonds be in an amount not less than ten percent (10%) of the maximum amount of bid, insurance certificates and any other required documents. In the event of failure to enter into said Contract or provide the necessary documents, said security will be forfeited.

The DISTRICT reserves the right to reject any or all bids or to waive any irregularities or informalities in any bids or in the bidding. No bidder may withdraw any bid for a period of **one hundred twenty (120) calendar days** after the date set for the opening of bids. Separate payment and performance bonds, each in an amount equal to 100% of the total Contract amount, are required, and shall be provided to the District prior to execution of the Contract and shall be in the form set forth in the Contract Documents. All bonds (Bid, Performance, and Payment) must be issued by a California admitted surety as defined in California Code of Civil Procedure Section 995-120.

BID PACKAGES: This project is being bid as "Bid Packages". Bidders will have the option to bid multiple bid packages, however the bidder must self-perform a minimum of 15% of each bid package and then provide bids with multiple bid packages combined. Example, if a bidder is interested in bidding the BP 22 Play Field Equipment & Structures AND BP 35 Photovoltaic Systems combined (for a lower bid overall price than if each package were submitted separately), then the bidder multiple bid packages are a bidder individual bids for each bid ackage were submitted separately), then the bidder MUST still submit a bid for each package numbers and the combined amount on the bid form document.
