# 20240724 PJCM Session #3 Euclid ES Whole Site Modernization GMP#1 – CC23-0125-23-A1-G1, Swinerton Transcript

#### **PSA Specialist Lead -Cruz Maria**

Thank you for joining us for the third pre job meeting for Euclid Elementary GMP one.

I'd like to start off by letting everyone know that this meeting is being recorded and a copy of the recording will be uploaded under this project under on the PSA cloud site.

So please use the tap feature to check in with us by letting letting us know who you are, what company you're with and how to get a hold of you again, whether email or phone number, and then we request that questions be asked under the Q&A feature to just for easier tracking to make sure all responses are responded to or go ahead and raise your hand in, put them in the meeting.

That way, as we start this meeting, everyone is muted.

If you have a comment question concern, please raise your hand and be recognized. Once recognized, we will enable you to unmute your MIC and to speak.

Now, when speaking, please be sure to identify who you are and what company or union you're from and who you're directing the question or comment to.

So if it's directly to the sub that we're speaking to, or if it's directly to the GC Now, if you don't have a microphone or encounter any glitches, please use the the chat featured to communicate with the group and our GC sweater team staff will read for you and then answer any questions in the chat.

Now to help save time during these meetings, we request that our Union reps accept assignments in the chat.

We do understand that for recording purposes have having it verbally noted is important, so I will read the acceptance before moving on to the the next contractor. And if we do not have any hands, comments, challenges, or acceptances in the chat, it's understood that the assignment is accepted final and will be noted as no comment, no issue in the meeting minutes.

So the chat and Q&A dogs, along with the meeting minutes will all be uploaded to the cloud for review.

After the meeting, then just to get into introductions, as most of you know, I am Maria Cruz.

I am the primary contact for the day to day questions regarding the PSA participation

for this project.

Also on the call is our PSA team minus our director Harris, who is currently on vacation.

But when he is here, any in any substantial matters or issues when they arise, they will be forwarded to him.

I want to welcome to today's meeting Steph, Steph, Vasic, Vlasic, our assistant project manager and I'm not sure if Stephanie Foy or see your senior project manager is here.

Both are from Swinnerton as the GC, so next we're just gonna be getting into reviewing the significance of the pre job conference.

So first thing is that it's a mandatory meeting under the section 8.5 of the PSA which states in short to avoid to avoid jurisdictional disputes, they pre job conference is required to be held prior to the start of work for all contractors at every level performing work covered by this agreement and then the purpose of this meeting is of course to review the scopes and determine the crafts to be used.

Establishing an estimated manpower needs getting an idea of the schedule of work for the contract, and of course the project working roles.

Now our Article 16 in the PSA goes into further detail describing the activities to take place at the pre job conference, noting that all work assignments should be disclosed by each contractor and if any formal jurisdictional disputes between unions on assignment pop up, they will be noted.

I'm gonna review how those are handled shortly.

Additionally, the purpose of the pre job conference is to bring together the district, the GCC subcontractors to your contractors and the unions to make sure everyone is on the same page with scopes and schedules.

Noting that every contractor with a signed contract or PO, including all levels of tier sub, must be identified and are required to sign and submit a letter of assent by the end of this meeting.

Our goal is that all work assignments will be completed being permanent and final. Next up is just a quick review of how the crew set up for our PSA projects work. The PSA implements what is called a composite crew concept, meaning if your company is not signatory to a union outside of these PSA projects and your work requires a crew of two or more, you're required to utilize the unions hiring hall for all manpower as a non signatory contractor, you are allowed three core workers per trade.

However, those core workers will need to be registered prior to starting work on site with the applicable union and or Union.

So if you have that Jack of art all trades, who does a little bit of everything, then he would definitely need to be signed up for all the work that he'd be performing under the different task in our section 3.6 in the PSA it the IT describes the composite crew which is made up of a ratio of 1 to one, one core worker to 1 union dispatch worker up to your 3 core workers.

So if you have a crew of, let's say 8, you're 3 core workers will be the first, third and 5th workers on site.

The Union dispatch workers are going to be the 2nd, 4th, 6th and then the 7th and 8th.

So all additional workers pass that six worker is union dispatched when requesting dispatch from the Union halls.

They contractor can and should stipulate any specific need, skills needed, certificates or requirements to complete the task, especially when it's something special.

Depending on the Union, the contractor can request workers by name and can request workers from the distract.

The districts identified priority ZIP codes so the district has our aspirational goals for employing 100% residents within the San Diego County.

This employees within the district boundaries and then more specific within the district's targeted ZIP codes, which I'll have been identified in the paperwork that goes out to the GC and to the Subs at today's meeting, each contractor will be asked to make a work assignment.

Each sub, including tier Subs, are responsible for making their own work.

Assignments at GCC cannot make a work assignment for sub.

Sub cannot make one for a tier.

All sub should have already completed the pre job form describing their work scope and assignments.

If you are a contractor on the call and have not completed that form, if you complete the form before the meetings over and we will definitely be able to roll back to you and review your form now.

The contractor has the right to choose the assignment of scopes as long as the Union being assigned claims and accepts it.

Once the scope of work is assigned to a crafter union, it is considered to be final and can only be changed in one or two ways.

The 1st way is the two unions involved.

Discuss and agree to the change or the the 2nd way is at the discretion of an arbitrator through a process that is outside of this PSA meeting changes other than work assignments need to be reflected in the pre job form and will need to be revise and resubmitted right away.

So items such as clarity on scope or more details of scope work being done and so on.

All right, now let's get into reviewing how this meeting's gonna go.

So staff will be describing the overall project scope and schedule, noting if they're already going to be planning to work or not.

Now this is the third meeting, so Swinnerton has already gone through.

If they're working or not, when I pull up the sub paperwork, I'm gonna announce them one by one in order.

When we come down here, we will see that only Subs that are white which are highlighted will be discussed.

Quite a few of them have already gone through this process.

Each sub will then raise their hand, be recognized, and then unmute themselves on their side.

They're going to describe the scope they're going to be performing, announced their work assignments.

That's to which Union they're giving that work to identify any tier Subs and then answer any questions from the Union.

If the sub is not present, staff will read the scope and assignments and answer any questions or take note of questions to give to the Subs to respond to later.

Now, if a Union challenges the work, one of the following scenarios is going to happen.

First, of course is we will check to see if the Union being assigned is present and accepts the work is described.

Next, if the Union assigned is absent, we will note the challenge and ensure the contractor is aware of the challenge.

If the sub is absent, the challenge will be noted in.

The GC will notify the sub of the challenge.

We do like to remind the contractors that the work assignments are 100% up to them and are final.

Uh work assignments will not be changed unless, again, the two unions agree.

Or an arbitrator orders it to reiterate from earlier just to help save time during these meetings, we do ask and the reps have been doing awesome with this, that reps accept assignments in the chat.

Now we do understand that some people are mobile.

If you're doing it on the phone, please raise your hand and accept verbally.

We will.

I will definitely accept the challenges once noted in the chat.

OK.

So Steph, I have up the current, umm contract for the project.

If you can go ahead and read that for us and then we will get into Murray companies, tier S Far West.
