Holmes Elementary is located in the community of Clairemont, surrounded by a residential neighborhood. The student population is mainly from these residents. The school received the high designation of being a California Department of Education Distinguished School in 2012 and 2018. Parent involvement is the key to their success, as well as their many and varied enrichment programs.

Built in the Mid-Century Modern that was popular in the 1950s, the campus has 40,151 square feet of facility space consisting of six permanent buildings and 12 portable classrooms buildings. These facilities house administration offices, classrooms, additional learning spaces, a library, and a multipurpose room with food services.

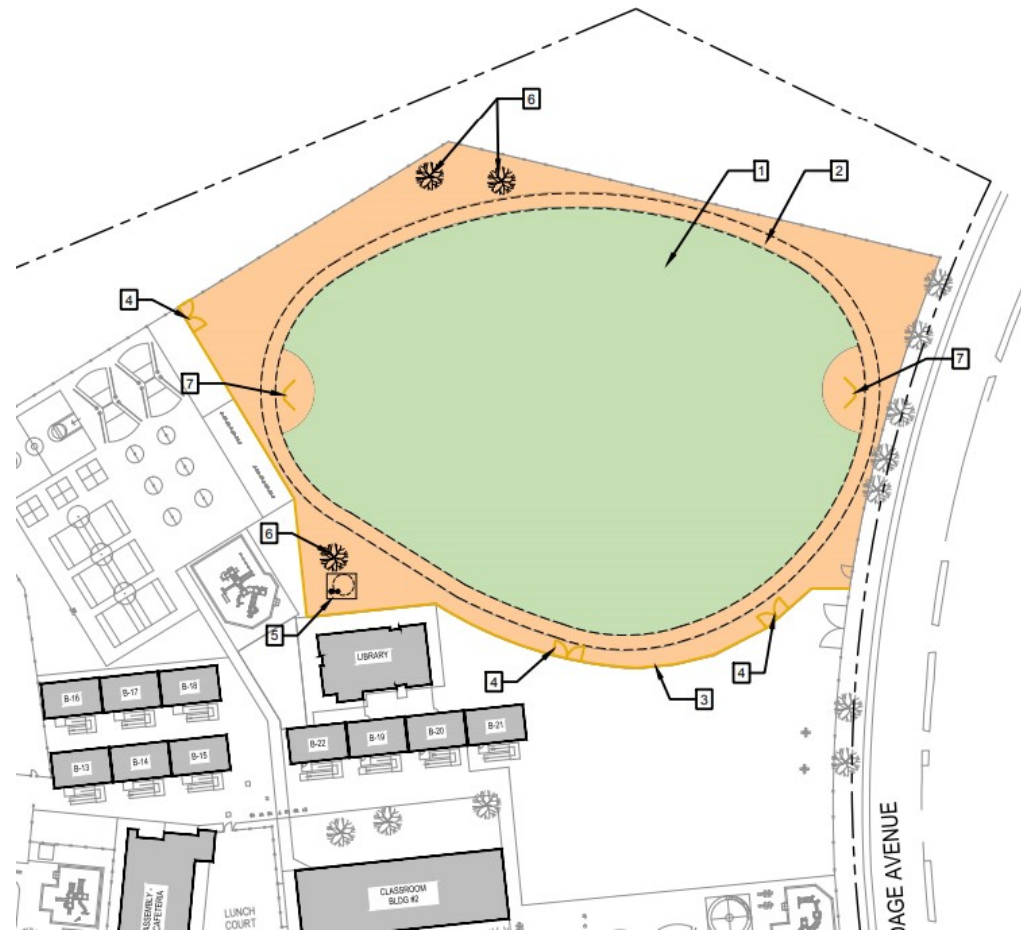

The scope of the project includes upgrades, renovation, and revitalization of existing Holmes Elementary facilities, construction of one-story 10-classroom building with new administration spaces, construct new 3 kindergarten classrooms to replace existing portable classrooms, expansion and renovation of food service facilities, demolition of 11 portables and 1 portable restroom. Modernization includes, but is not limited to, building systems upgrades and replacement, improvements to support learning and instruction, health, safety and security, accessibility and code compliance, energy efficiency and sustainability. A detailed scope of work is being developed using input from the school community and facilities condition assessments.
